Visitor Experience Goals 1) Strive for a quality, safe visitor experience
 Trails not next to roads, subdivisions 2) Build & maintain "enough" trails
 Complete long-sought trail connections within OSMP& adjacent public lands Build enough designated trails that most members of the public will stay on trail
 Eliminate duplicative or unsustainable trails, re-route when necessary Maintain trails adequately. Acknowledge that social trails get people where they want to go
 Maintain policy of encouraging on-trail use but don't eliminate off-trail use by ped's and equestrians
 Spread recreation over many trails to reduce both user conflicts and environmental pressures
3) Build some additional infrastructureRest rooms at trailheads
 Sufficient parking at trailheads (incl. horse trailers)
Management Process Goals
1) Balance recreation and preservation in OS philosophy
 Apply objective standards in decision-making (Limits of Acceptable Change, trail density, carrying capacity, etc.)
 Evaluate % open, % closed space (public has expectation of reasonable access to public land)
2) Apply objective science to management decisions
 Beware biased data collection and interpretation, leading questions, fears, opinions, assumptions
3) Balance recreation and preservation on staff and OSBT
Public Process Goals
1) Emphasize education over regulation
• Will reduce user conflicts
• Will result in voluntary compliance
2) Encourage volunteersWill raise awareness and stewardship
3) Involve and respect the public and stakeholder groups
Organize and support forums, roundtable discussion groups
• Formalize liaisons between OSBT and stakeholder groups

• Sponsor field trips to encourage exchange of ideas, awareness of issues
