#### Track Is Coming

We invite and encourage all Summit students to join the Summit Track Team. The season begins April 13 and ends May 15 (7<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> grades) and May 22 (6<sup>th</sup> grade). Summit traditionally has outstanding participation in track and everyone enjoys achieving personal goals while feeling the camaraderie of a team sport. A meeting with Coaches Blakemore, Kolanowski and Liebowitz will be held Wednesday, April 4, during lunch in Room 6. Please pick up your forms by the office and turn them in with your check ASAP.

IMPORTANT: Double check that your school sports physical is current. They expire after one year exactly so if you had your check-up after April of 2006, you will need to get another one. Each year we have quite a few students who are not allowed to start practice because of a missing physical form. Check now!!

We practice daily, except meet days. Generally, we jog up to Fairview to use their quality track and equipment. Practices go until 4:15 or 4:30. If we are at Fairview, you may pick up your child there or s/he will jog back down to Summit.

#### Important Reminders from the Summit Health Room:

We've had lots of children coming to school ill in the last couple of months. Please remember:

- If your child is not feeling well, please keep him/her home – don't spread the illness!

- A child with a fever the evening or night before should stay home the next day.

- A child with conjunctivitis (pink-eye) should be on antibiotics for 24 hours before returning to school.

- A child with chicken pox should be fever-free and all lesions should be scabbed over before returning to school.

- When your child is home sick, please leave a message on the attendance line (x500) each day.

- Students have two days for each day of an excused absence to make up missed homework and assignments.

- Students may use www.schoolnotes.com or fellow students as resources to find out about missed homework.

Students who are home ill for three days or more may make a "homework request" to teachers via the office. Please allow 24 hours for this to be completed (or until the end of the following school day).

Please remember that Tantra is the main drop-off, pick-up point for Summit students. The Summit parking lot is for teachers and staff ONLY. Our parking lot monitors set up cones to remind you that you are not to use the parking lot for pick-up and drop-off during the 7:55 – 8:10 a.m. and 3:00 – 3:20 time slots. Only parents volunteering at school or with a student having trouble walking may enter the parking lot during these times. Recently, there have been incidents of parents arguing with our monitors over access to the lot. We ask that you please respect our parking lot monitors who are simply doing the job Summit administration has asked of them - to ensure available parking for our staff, keep the parking lot congestionfree and safer for our students who walk or ride bikes to school.

#### Summit MathCounts Team: State Champs!

Congratulations to the Summit MathCounts team for their first place finish at the state competition held at the University of Denver on March 17. This is the second consecutive first place finish for the Summit MathCounts team at the state competition. This year's team consisted of Ben Alpert, Alexander Black, Chris Guthrie, and Charles Xu.

Summit had three of the top 10 finishers in the individual competition. Ben Alpert finished 10th overall, Alexander Black finished 6th and Chris Guthrie finished in 2nd place. Other students who qualified to compete at the state level were Sam Berens, Will Conway and Will Kuelthau. With Chris's 2nd place finish he will be traveling to Fort Worth, Texas in May to compete at the national competition.

A very special "thank you" goes out to Ms Silva Chang as the team coach. Ms Chang has done an extraordinary job in preparing our students to perform well in these very challenging math competitions and for providing a very valuable math enrichment program at Summit. As the coach of the winning team, Ms Chang will be accompanying the Colorado team to the national competition in Fort Worth.
