
# An Overview of Construction Plans for Summit

While Summit administrators, faculty, and parents have created a wonderful learning environment for students, they long for the day when Summit will have a building that comes closer to matching the quality of the education offered within it.

## That day is now within sight.

With cooperation between the Boulder Valley School District and our charter school, an agreement was reached that will provide Summit with almost \$7 million in additional funding invested in our educational facilities. The District will provide \$5.5 million for two new science labs, an art room, and a library as well as reconfiguring existing square footage for a tech lab and better space for staff and teachers. Summit will remain a small middle school, and the educational setting for every student will vastly improve. Summit, in return, agreed to raise at least \$1 million from parents and friends to build a freestanding gymnasium. (cont.)

#### Phase 1

The first phase of construction, funded by the BVSD bond issue of November 2006, will add a new 4500 sq ft library, 2 new 1100 sq ft science labs, and a new 1100 sq ft art room. We will then use the three "old" classrooms to give homes to teachers who currently must travel between classrooms. Additionally, the former library space will be converted into an additional technology lab and larger work space for teachers and administrators. The current front office space will be reconfigured to provide a more appropriate work space for our registrars and office assistants, provide a more private and larger health room and provide space in the office for parents and students to wait.

Additionally, we will upgrade the telecommunications system, expand and improve our parking area, and provide cooling to the technology labs and some other areas in the existing building. All of these changes will make for much more productive and appealing space for our students, faculty and staff.

Special considerations have gone into the design of the building to make it environmentally friendly, including daylighting through rooftop tubes, use of geothermal heating and cooling and the selection of "healthier" building materials.

We expect the first phase of construction to begin in December 2007 and hope to be completed in the fall of 2008. All interior work in the existing building is planned to be done over the summer. Though the construction phase will of course provide challenges in parking, noise, and distractions, our faculty and staff will continuously work with the construction contractor to reduce the impact on our students as much as possible.

#### Phase 2

Design work for Phase 2 will begin soon. The second phase of construction will build a gymnasium, locker rooms and bathrooms on the north end of our site (in the area behind the current portables). The new gym will be designed to foster community at Summit. For the first time since our inception, Summit teams will have the opportunity to host home games. The multi-purpose space will allow the school to hold educational events such as History Day and the Science Fair, and will provide a wonderful place for students to congregate and families to get to know each other at Summit social events. We plan to build the gym to "green" environmental standards.

Fundraising for construction has begun. Founding parent Barb Kostanick is the chairwoman of the Capital Campaign. Barb, the Summit Board, and members of the Capital Campaign Committee have been working together over the last six months to plan a strategy for raising this money and to get commitments from donors. Construction of the gym will begin as soon as we have pledges for the money required to build.

We are excited to begin building the "new" Summit for our children.

#### **Counseling Program Notes**

High School Open Enrollment

By now, all 8th grade parents should have received two e-mails regarding high school enrollment from the Summit counseling office. One e-mail includes a list of all of the high school information nights and other events for prospective students offered during the open enrollment period in the Boulder Valley School District. The other includes an attachment with Summit's High School Course Placement Recommendation Guidelines, for students and parents to review in planning their student's high school program.

Mrs. Bartley also visited all 8th grade classes on November 13th, and provided hard copies of the information that had been e-mailed to parents. The processes of open enrollment and high school registration, as well as Summit's course placement recommendation guidelines, were discussed.

Students and their parents are highly encouraged to attend the high school information nights at the schools their students may wish to attend. The Boulder High and Fairview High Showcase evening presentations are the week after Thanksgiving break. Students who wish to open enroll to a high school other than their neighborhood high school will need to submit an application during the open enrollment period, from Nov. 26 to January 18. Students who will be attending their neighborhood high school should not submit an open enrollment application, and instead will simply register for courses in February.

## **Open Enrollment Begins November 26**

If you have a 5th grader (sibling of a current student) who is interested in attending Summit next year, don't forget to fill out an Open Enrollment application! Forms will be available on the BVSD website (www.bvsd.org) beginning Monday, November 26 and must be turned in to the Open Enrollment office no later than 4:00 p.m. on January 18. Siblings of current Summit students are not automatically enrolled here, so please remember this important window to enroll your student. In addition, if you have moved out of the Boulder Valley School District boundaries since the last open enrollment period, you must open enroll your child again. Please call the office if this applies to you!

If the weather is bad and school is not closed, please remember to allow extra time for getting to school so that students will be on time.
